Dog Deaths in the New Forest: 'Alabama Rot'

The technical name for 'Alabama Rot' is Idiopathic Cutaneous and Renal Glomerular Vasculopathy (CRGV). This disease has been seen in the USA since the 1980's and was initially thought to only affect greyhounds.

However, since December 2012 there have been 19 reported cases in the UK (12 from the New Forest and 7 from other counties), in a variety of dog breeds.

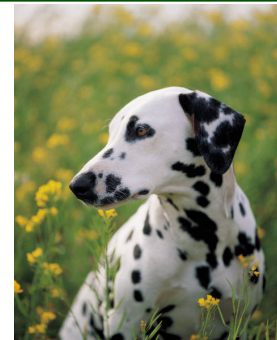
No cases were seen after April 2013, until December 2013 and since then there have been 5 confirmed cases which had been walked in the New Forest (Brockenhurst, Wilverley Inclosure, Tiptoe, Holmesley campsite and Gordleton). There are a further 5 suspected cases from across the UK. Unfortunately despite intensive treatment only one dog has survived from those affected since December 2013.

The disease causes skin lesions which have typically been below the elbow or knee and have presented as an area of redness or swelling or as a raw area like an ulcer. Within a week these dogs have gone on to show signs of kidney failure such as vomiting, reduced appetite and reduced energy.

The cause of this disease is still unknown despite extensive testing but it is important to remember that it is only a very small number of dogs who have been affected, especially considering how many are walked in the New Forest on a daily basis. It also does not appear to pass between dogs.

Until the underlying cause is found it is difficult to give specific advice on how to reduce your dog's risk. If you are at all concerned that your dog is showing any of the signs associated with the disease then do contact the practice as soon as possible as prompt aggressive treatment gives the best chance of a good outcome. However please remember that most skin lesions seen will not be caused by this disease and that there are many other much more common causes of kidney failure.

Anderson Moores Veterinary Specialists near Winchester in Hampshire have taken most of the referrals for these cases and are collating information on cases from across the UK. Please check our Facebook page for updates on the situation.

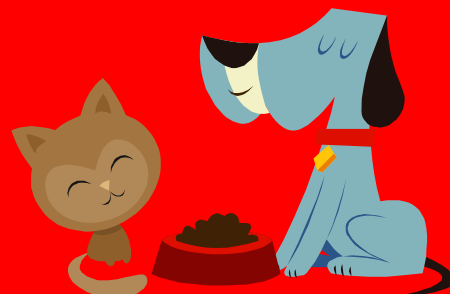

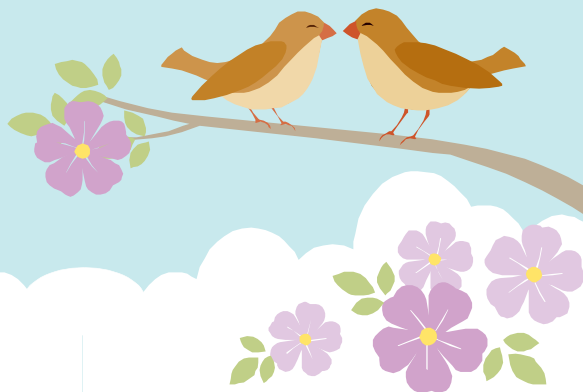
Spring Wildlife

Just a reminder, as (hopefully!) the warmer weather approaches, to remember to follow the RSPCA's advice with regard to young wildlife.

Fledgling birds leave the nest just before they can fly and are fed by their parents on the ground so just because they don't fly off it does not necessarily mean they are unwell. The parents of a baby bird will often be close by, waiting for you to leave before they reappear. You won't do any harm by moving a baby bird from an exposed area to some nearby cover if you think they are at risk but don't take them any distance or the parents will be unable to find them. The same applies to fox cubs who are often out in the open at an early age with parents close by.

Although local wildlife charities do a great job, the best chance of survival for most of these young animals is staying in their natural environment and being raised by their parents

If you believe the animal is sick or injured then do bring them to the surgery but take care not to be scratched or bitten. Make sure they are in a secure carrier or cardboard box that is warm, dark and well ventilated and please give us a call first so we know you are coming.
